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#### **Administrator's Statement**

#### 971 College of the Mainland

College of the Mainland (COM) was established in 1962, in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas, to service the educational needs of Texas City and the surrounding communities. College of the Mainland has constructed pathways for student success by providing two-year associate degrees, transfer credits and certificates. Steadfast in its support to the Mainland community, COM has also become a critical hub for leaders and organizations to envision and plan for future growth. Further developing these collaborative efforts is central to COM's strategic plan.

COM has expanded geographically and now operates multiple learning centers - COM Main Campus and COM League City.

COM has faced unprecedented challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic. COM realized a decline in enrollment. In addition, COM experienced increased expenses in the areas of personal health & safety protection, distance education and technology upgrades.

College of the Mainland respectfully supports the \$2.03 billion formula funding request submitted by the Texas Association of Community Colleges (TACC) in its letter to the Legislative Budget Board and the Governor's Office, Budget Division. State support remains critical to the district as it continues to fulfil its statutory role and mission to offer vocational, technical, and academic courses for certificate, transfer, and degree programs. Together with Texas' other 49 community college districts, we will continue do much of the heavy lifting in the state's efforts to achieve the Building a Talent Strong Texas strategic plan. Expanded state investments in community colleges will support dual credit courses that give high school students an early start in postsecondary education; initiatives to recruit uncredentialed Texans and support them through graduation; and the creation and expansion of programs built on the skills necessary for gainful employment and Texas' continued economic growth. COM did not experience any significant policy changes.

The following information provides information significant to College of the Mainland and future provisions for the student population, employees, and facilities.

#### **Increasing Student Success**

- COM will continue to implement the Corequisite and Pathways model, or Finish Faster Initiative, to help our students complete college preparation courses at the same time as credit courses.
- The instructional department will hire additional tutors, faculty, and adjunct instructors.
- The College will provide additional fund balance dollars for instructional needs so no student is turned away.
- The Academic Master Plan identified strategies to increase student success. These strategies include:
- o Offering AS degrees in Chemical and Mechanical Engineering and an AS in Cyber Security
- Launching an Accelerated Associate of Arts degree.
- o Expanding its allied health offerings to include Radiology and Surgical Technician programs.
- o Implement guaranteed course schedules for students to improve timely completion of their programs.
- The budget will fund technology tools. This funding will place greater emphasis on spending time with students from the point of entry through graduation or transfer with improved career and major exploration, degree planning, early warning, and ongoing communications with students and faculty.
- Student Services will optimize efficiency and increase customer service to manage student services' inquiries with an inbound call center for Admissions and Records and Financial Aid and outbound support to prospective students that positively impact enrollment decisions.

#### **Expanding Employee Opportunities**

- The budget provides funding for deferred maintenance for existing buildings to improve facility usage and safety for students and employees.
- COM continues to fund health and dental insurance for employees.
- Improved Facilities
- Utilize fund balance to cover non-recurring facilities expenses.
