



## COLLEGIATE HIGH SCHOOL PROFILE

---

CHS offers rigorous academic instruction, career guidance, academic counseling, and work-based learning opportunities. By optimizing dual credit opportunities, students are able to complete high school graduation and associate degree requirements simultaneously. As a middle college high school approved through the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board, CHS students are exempt from the general dual credit limitations of only two college classes per semester; additionally, freshmen and sophomores are allowed admission with special permission from their home high school campus. Students complete their full school day at College of the Mainland.

Students at CHS may be enrolled in a participating public school district or attend as a private school student. Along with maintaining eligibility to participate in their high school activities, CHS students are actively engaged in extracurricular activities on the college campus. High School students band together in their own club on campus, Nu Psi, which focuses on activities that serve their home campus, the college and the community.

The course load taken varies according to each student. Students work with staff to develop an individual graduation plan that demonstrates what each student will need to accomplish in order to earn both his/her high school diploma and associate degree
