OSHA's Top 10: #4 Scaffolding

Currently at #4 on OSHA's 2021 Top 10 List for Most Frequently Cited Standards, the Scaffold standard continues to be cited as much for scaffold structure as it does for the lack of fall prevention when using scaffolding on work sites. This class will cover the standard requirements for various types of scaffold structures and assembly procedures, how scaffolding and fall protection go hand-in-hand, and the need for competent person and trained employees on the work site.

Confined Space Safety

This course utilizes the OSHA 29 CFR 1910.146 permit-required confined space standard for general industry to show students how to work identify hazards in a confined space environment to maximize safety for you and those around you. After completing this course students will be able to: understand the scope and application of OSHA's confined space entry standards; identify "confined spaces" and determine if they are "permit required"; a review of confined space permit requirements; pre-entry space preparation, know the responsibilities of entrants, attendants, supervisors and rescuers; understand the requirements of Rescue & Emergency Services and have a basic knowledge of the general use and limitations of safety equipment.
