Instructor Information

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Course Description

How to use the internet-based Design Space for Cricut users and how to design and cut your projects.

Required Supplies

Basic tools - scissors, glue, xacto knife, picks for weeding, lint roller. Most you can find around your home. No supplies are required at first. We will discuss the different tools and papers that can be used. Do not need a Cricut Die cutting machine to attend class. Must have a laptop or tablet capable of accessing the internet and establish a FREE account at Cricut Design Space.

End-of-Course Outcomes

Upon successful completion of this course, students will: know how to use the internet-based Design Space for Cricut users and how to design and cut projects.

Course Outline

Week 1: Intro to 12 weeks, Procedures, Tool info, and equipment information. Access to Design space and setting up your Cricut. You may purchase material of your choice for the projects we will complete in class. There are many types of vinyl. We will discuss which one you will want to purchase for projects. We will discuss the type of paper needed to make shadow boxes and Luminaries. You will be told what material you will need in this syllabus.

- Week 2: learn the commands used on the canvas in Design space. SLICE, WELD, ATTACH, AND CONTOUR by creating and manipulating an image. Learn how to upload an SVG file from source on the internet.
- **Week 3**: Discussion about Heat Transfer Vinyl types. Start project for seasonal Holidays. Access an image or svg file. Make the file or image your own using the commands in Design Space.
- Week 4: Discussion on attachments and using other blades. Learn about and cut vinyl for decorations on cups glass or signs or plaques. Learn the answer to Mirror or not to Mirror. Continue working on projects.
- Week 5: learn how to make a stencil and etch on glass
- **Week 6:** Start new projects. Learn about Iron on, specialty material, and sport flex iron on and how to tell which side to cut. Learn about window cling and 651 and 751 car decal vinyl from other sources besides cricut.
- Week 7: Create and cut a vinyl project. Discuss what to glass etch. ...glass in a picture frame, cups, glasses for etching project on week #8
- Week 8: Learn how to make a shadow box and luminaries for all occasions. Learn the custom materials dial on the cricut. How to add a material such as dura-lar (a plastic paper) to the custom dial. Complete projects. Talk about where to purchase item for Iron-on materials and the different types for next class
- Week 9: Complete Projects. Discuss Infusible Ink, and upload or choose an image to transfer to an item of your choice. Remember it must have more polyester to work with the infusible ink.
- **Week 10:** Learn about importing fonts from internet sites and how to use in Design Space. Continue work or begin new project. Discuss what to use with T-Shirt transfer paper. Upload a picture to Print and cut, then print to T-Shirt paper. Import pictures into design space to use as Print and Cut files. Print onto t-shirt transfer paper. Put picture on transfer paper using a printer before you cut on cricut machine.
- Week 11: Make a card using vinyl and card stock. Upload image from internet or cricut images.
- Week 12: Week 12- Finish all projects. Discuss what we have learned.
