



Soon he finds himself drawn into a web of love, lies, deceit, and danger. A Day at The Museums

The day will start with a guided tour at the **BUFFALO SOLDIERS NATIONAL MUSEUM** which tells the story of the historic Buffalo Soldiers, and the history of African Americans in the US military. African Americans have served proudly in every great American war. In 1866, through an act of Congress, legislation was adopted to create six all African American Army units. The units were identified as the 9th and 10th cavalry and the 38th, 40th, and 41st infantry regiments. The four infantry regiments were later reorganized to form the 24th and 25th infantry regiments. These fighting men represented the first Black professional soldiers in a peacetime

army. The recruits came from varied backgrounds including former slaves and veterans from service in the Civil War. Next stop, a self-guided tour at the HOLOCAUST MUSEUM. In 1981. Siegi Izakson, a Holocaust survivor and longtime Houston resident, had an epiphany. After attending an international gathering of Holocaust survivors in Israel, Izakson realized his peers were getting older, and as they passed away their stories and memories of unchecked prejudice would go with them. In March 1996, just 13 years after Izakson first dreamed of the idea, Holocaust Museum Houston was officially opened for admission with Izakson proclaiming, "This means the Holocaust story will not go away." After a \$34 million expansion, the Museum reopened in June 2019 after more than doubling in size to a total of 57,000 square feet. Charged with educating students and the public about the dangers of prejudice and hatred in society, it is ranked as the nation's fourth largest Holocaust Museum and fully bilingual in English and Spanish. A buyyour-own lunch will be scheduled mid-day.

Juneteenth Poetry Slam

Juneteenth celebrates June 19, 1865, the day Union Army forces occupied Galveston and read General Order No. 3, freeing slaves still in bondage. As part of this annual celebration, the City of Texas City hosts its annual poetry slam, a competitive event in which poets perform their work and are judged by a panel. The event is held locally at the Doyle Convention Center so there will be no transportation included.



It is operated by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department in partnership with the Coastal Conservation Association, The Dow Chemical Company and US Fish and Wildlife Service Sportfish Restoration Funds. The facility opened in 1996 and includes a visitor center with aguaria and exhibits of Texas marine life, the largest redfish hatchery in the world, 36 one-acre fish culture ponds, an outdoor wetland exhibit and a youth fishing pond. A buy-your-own lunch will follow the tours.

Sarah Sings a Love Song (Ensemble Theatre)





CAMPUS CARRY


